THIS EAST DOWNTOWN PROJECT has

"When we have the opportunity to work with true trades professionals, it makes our work quicker and easier every day," he said.

Of course, topping off is also a noteworthy occasion for future residents. It's a good indication that move-in dates are not too far off. Less than two years since first breaking ground, initial occupancies for Core
